

Aida Luz Maisonet Giachello, Ph.D is an educator and a writer and uses research to address health equity and social justice issues. She is a research professor at the Department of Preventive Medicine at Feinberg School of Medicine, Northwestern University-Chicago. In December 2010 she retired from the University of Illinois-Chicago (UIC) after 25 years of teaching and conducting health disparity research. There she established in 1993 the UIC Midwest Latino Health Research, Training & Policy Center and conducted research and research training with a focus on chronic conditions such as diabetes, hypertension, asthma; injury prevention, tobacco control, obesity and occupational health. Throughout the years, she has trained/mentored minority students, junior faculty, health care providers and community health workers

in conducting public health research using community participatory and community engagement approaches. She has conducted advocacy and policy work emerging from the research findings. In her over 40 years of professional work she has developed community interventions models that are being used in U.S., Puerto Rico, US-Mexico borders and other Latin American countries and Virgin Islands. At Northwestern University (NU), she was until 2013 Co-PI of the Hispanic Community Health Study/Study of Latinos (HCHS/SOL) Chicago Field Center- Wave I--the largest multi-site NIH research study on Hispanic/Latino cardiovascular and related conditions. Currently, she is a co-investigator of the HCHS/SOL. She also is: a) co-Leader of the NU, Community Engagement Core of the NIH NCI Cancer Health Equity Collaborative (PI: M Simon), in partnership with three local universities; b) co-Investigator of the sleep apnea and cognitive functions among persons 65 years and older; c) a formal PI of the NU American Heart Association's Tobacco Regulatory and Addiction Center (A-TRAC), a NIH NHLBI & FDA multi-academic institutions conducting tobacco regulatory research; d) MPI of the Religion/Spirituality and Health study, a HCHS/SOL Ancillary study, and, investigator, of the UIC Community Engagement Core of the NIH Precision Medicine Initiative (PMI), known as All of Us.

Dr. Giachello is a medical sociologist. She has a Bachelor degree from the University of Puerto Rico; a Master's degree, and a Ph.D. from the University of Chicago. She has been featured in local and national/international English and Spanish TV, radio and printed media and has received over 40+ awards and recognitions for her research and public policy work, including being named as *One of 25 Most Influential Hispanic in American* by Times Magazine in 2005, One of 100 Most Influential Hispanics by Hispanic Business Magazine in 2005, and received by the University of Chicago's President the Alumni Diversity Award, in 2014.
